A fertile environment for research and teaching

Saint Mary's is a university that exceeds all growth expectations when it comes to research and teaching. Of course every university strives for excellence in these key areas. But Saint Mary's stands above the crowd with more Canada Research Chairs per student than at any other university in the country and rising levels of external funding. So what is the secret of our success?

SAINT MARY'S has increased its externally funded research from just under \$3 million in 2003 to \$10 million in 2007. According to the Research Infosource report on Canada's top 50 universities, the average growth of research income at Canadian universities during 2007 was just 3.5%. In comparison, Saint Mary's enjoyed a 47% increase—by far the highest percentage increase in the country.

"There is a culture change going on," explains Dr Kevin Vessey, Dean of Graduate Studies and Research. "In its academic plan, the university set out its intention to expand its graduate program by increasing internal funding for students and by attracting the best faculty and high calibre students."

There is no question that research funding, graduate student numbers and the number of research projects have all been growing at unprecedented rates, reflecting the quality of faculty, students and research carried out at the university. "This success shows that when the university makes a plan and sticks to it, incredible things can happen," says Vessey.

Our students learn from the best, such as Dr Edna Keeble, a professor in the Department of Political

Science who has received multiple awards for teaching excellence and is currently the university's Teaching Scholar for 2008-09. Dr Tony Charles, a professor of Management Science and Environmental Studies, won a 2008 Visionary Award from the Gulf of Maine Council on the Marine Environment for his work on combining marine conservation with support for coastal fishing communities across the Maritimes. And just recently, Dr E Kevin Kelloway was appointed a Tier 1 Canada Research Chair in Occupational Health Psychology. He will receive \$1.4 million in funding to help him carry out research into occupational health and safety, particularly on how leadership affects the wellbeing of employees.

Our research success can only continue to grow as both students and faculty use the new research facilities on campus to explore in new directions, supported by ultra-modern labs and learning spaces in the newly renovated Science Building. Thanks to the generosity of our loyal donors, the new Atrium and Global Learning Commons will open its doors to students and professors this autumn. These new facilities will help us to continue to attract the best minds and the funding that supports their research.

The landscape of the university is changing, and so is the environment in which our students and faculty work. With new facilities and a growing stream of funding to enrich our research activities, Saint Mary's will continue to provide a fertile field in which graduate and undergraduate students, professors and new ideas can grow.

The facts speak for themselves:

- Saint Mary's has eight Canada Research Chairs, the highest number for a university of our size.
- We are the second most research intensive university in the Maritimes.
- We were awarded \$1.5 million in Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada (NSERC) funding over five years to build research capacity, just one of seven universities across Canada to receive one of these grants.
- Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) grants awarded to our professors and students totalled more than \$750,000 for 2008-09.
- In the 2008-09 academic year, we provided over \$4.5 million in scholarships and bursaries to our students.
- Over 98% of our full-time faculty have doctoral degrees.

An extraordinary life and an extraordinary vision

SAINT MARY'S UNIVERSITY BSc graduate Robin Rigby passed away in a tragic motor vehicle accident in December 2007 near her home in Shirahama, Japan. She was 30 years old. Less than a year later, when many parents would still be immobilized by the shock, Doug and Mary Rigby of Halifax had turned their tragedy into something positive. The Robin Rigby Trust has already awarded crucial funding to three young researchers who are now pursuing research in the field of coastal management that Robin loved so well.

The Robin Rigby Trust is an extraordinary gift to Saint Mary's University and the young people it is benefiting, now and in the future. Through this trust, Doug and Mary Rigby have pledged \$150,000 to Saint Mary's, \$25,000 of which will be paid out in awards each year for the next six years. The awards are aimed at young people who are conducting research in some aspect of coastal management. They can be Canadian students who want to study abroad, or students from other countries wishing to study in Canada.

The Rigbys' connection with Saint Mary's dates back to Robin's years as an undergraduate here. As someone

with dyslexia, she found school challenging. But when she arrived at university, say her parents, "Saint Mary's opened the world to her. She had the support of the Atlantic Centre when she needed it and we all appreciated the values-oriented education she received, with its emphasis on service and commitment to community."

Robin graduated with her BSc from Saint Mary's, then went on to earn an MSc at Dalhousie and a PhD from Hokkaido University in Japan. At the time of her death, she was working as the co-ordinator of NaGISA (Natural Geography in Shore Areas) at the Seto Marine Biological Laboratory of Kyoto University.

"This award," says Tony Charles, a professor of Management Science and Environmental Studies at Saint Mary's, "is one of the most innovative donations I've ever heard of." The Rigbys are equally enthusiastic about the university's response to their proposal. "We spoke initially with Tony Charles, who works in Robin's area of study, and Heather Fitzpatrick from the Development Office," says Doug. "We were surprised and thrilled at their openness and flexibility, and grateful that the university has allowed us to house the trust there."

"The university was willing to imagine with us," adds Mary, "and it was sympathetic to our wish to move forward quickly and with as little red tape as possible. We were amazed by its extraordinary vision."

Tony Charles agrees. "This project has gone from concept to reality in a very short time," he says. "We've seen results right away. There was a good batch of applicants and the initial three award recipients provide a nice balance of work. This trust is helping to support their dreams. And for Saint Mary's, being able to channel these funds is very much an outreach activity, one that is socially responsible and that has the potential to benefit international students. It reflects our mission and values in an innovative way."

Saint Mary's financially administers the trust and a five-member volunteer panel selects and monitors the projects that receive funding through the trust. Mary is a member of this volunteer panel but abstains from selecting individuals to receive funding. "We wanted one of us to be there to show our continued commitment to the trust, but not to interfere in the decision-making."

Mary and Doug set up the Robin Rigby Trust to be a celebration of Robin's life and, as Mary says, "to put into action our commitment to Robin." It works both ways. "We at Saint Mary's University celebrate the Rigbys' commitment to research and education and extend our gratitude for this generous and thoughtful gift to young researchers," says Heather Fitzpatrick, Director of Development.

Anuradha Rao

Anuradha Rao’s field of study is coastal conservation and rehabilitation and the identification of coastal resources. Her project is taking place in the Kommetjie community area on the Southern Cape Peninsula of South Africa. Working with South Africa environmental and wildlife groups, Anu plans to engage the local community in the restoration of sand dunes and beaches. Part of the project will involve replacing alien plant species with native ones, and Anu hopes that the project will also provide employment and training to some of the more disadvantaged people in the area.

“This award has given me a great opportunity to take an idea and explore it, giving me valuable experience that I can take back to Canada. I’m very grateful to the Robin Rigby Trust for allowing me to do this work and for providing another important stepping stone in my career.”

Tiffanie Rainville

Tiffanie Rainville is studying the impact of climate change on coastal communities. Her four months of fieldwork will take her to southern Ecuador where she will look closely at three mangrove communities. Her aim is to assess the value of the mangroves to the local communities in terms of water quality and protection from rising sea levels, and to find ways to help those communities understand and protect themselves from threats to the mangroves.

“The Robin Rigby Trust made my whole project possible,” says Tiffanie. “I am thrilled and honoured—and very thankful—to have received this wonderful and generous award from the Rigbys. My project would have been just a dream without them.”

Melanie Zurba

Melanie Zurba’s field of study is sustainable coastal and marine resource management and indigenous co-management systems. Her fieldwork will be spent in Caldwell, Northern Queensland, Australia, working with the Giringun Aboriginal Corporation and looking at the relationship between the Giringun and the government. She hopes to help create an indigenous protected area (IPA) that will give local people more say over how the area and its resources are used. The framework of the

IPA created in Australia will then be related back to a coastal area in Canada.

“I am very happy and grateful to have received this award,” says Mel. “I am very passionate about my field of study and its potential to make a difference. To be given this wonderful opportunity to explore solutions is very personally rewarding to me.”

A legacy of learning

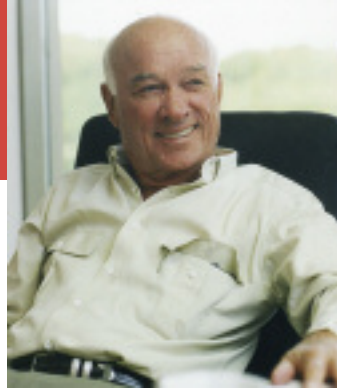
THE HARRISON MCCAIN SCHOLARSHIP is one of the most prestigious and generous awards for students at Saint Mary's University, and we are grateful to the Harrison McCain Foundation for its generosity and loyal support.

The late Harrison McCain, CC, one of the founders of McCain Foods and a great supporter of higher education, created the Harrison McCain Award Program in 1998 as a legacy to help students who did not have the financial means to attend university in Atlantic Canada.

Since 2006, four Saint Mary's students have received awards, each worth a total of \$16,000 over four years, and the foundation has committed to funding two further awards in 2009-10. These awards provide extraordinary educational opportunities for students who demonstrate

a passion for learning through their high school grades, leadership qualities and their own initiative in funding their education.

Award recipients highly value these scholarships because they acknowledge their hard work. These scholarships also help to make university education more accessible and allow students to concentrate on their studies without the distraction of part-time jobs or the worry of a growing debt load. Our thanks go to the Harrison McCain Foundation and other donors who help to make a university education possible for many students.

The Atrium: donations in action

GENEROUS DONATIONS to the *Hearts and Minds* Capital Campaign from alumni, faculty, staff, organizations, foundations and the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency are currently being transformed into the Atrium and Global Learning Commons. When this ambitious new building is completed in the autumn of 2009, it will be a living laboratory and open learning centre for faculty, students and the wider Saint Mary's community.

The \$17.5 million, 43,000 sq ft Atrium will link the Patrick Power Library and the Burke and Science Buildings. At its heart is the Global Learning Commons, a wireless, barrier-free communal learning space that will provide flexible space for learning and discussion.

Open spaces, multi-use classrooms, a 100-seat lecture room, lab space and a new Information and Technology Centre will all help to create a social network setting that will support the learning environment.

The new Atrium is also a positive demonstration of Saint Mary's commitment to sustainability. It will be a LEED-certified building, which means that it embraces sustainable building technologies. A highlight of the building is the three-storey interior "biowall" that naturally filters out volatile organic compounds and carbon dioxide from the air. The building is topped by an experimental green roof

that will contain eight research growing pods equipped with monitoring sensors and meters.

WHEN A STUDENT CALLS to ask you to donate to the Annual Giving Campaign, of course we hope you will say "yes". But we also hope that you will see the call as an opportunity to catch up with your alma mater. Ask how the Huskies are doing or find out about the Atrium. The student at the other end of the telephone line will be delighted to chat.

When a student calls

Alex Steeves, one of the supervisors at the Saint Mary's call centre, explains that the student callers really enjoy making connections with alumni when they speak with them. "We have callers from different areas of study, who can speak different languages, and those with special interests, such as sports. We try to give the callers a sense of who they will be talking to before they pick up the phone and match them with alumni of similar interests."

Many students are nervous about calling to ask for money when they first start in the call centre, says Steeves. But often they are pleasantly surprised by the response they get. "Our callers have an opportunity to remind alumni of what Saint Mary's is all about. They often find that they really connect with the person they are calling through their shared interest in the university."

The call centre employs 16 callers and three supervisors. All new callers are thoroughly trained before they start

work and they are also encouraged to "know the school" and visit the new buildings on campus so that they can talk about them knowledgeably.

Young alumni tend to be particularly interested in the physical changes taking place on campus, but for older alumni, too, Saint Mary's is "very dear to their hearts." Steeves tells the story of how one caller struck up a friendly rapport with an alumnus in the course of a telephone conversation, culminating in a \$5000 donation.

"It's important to say to donors that the callers do care," says Steeves. "They get excited when they talk to alumni, particularly when the conversation just clicks. And of course we are grateful for every donation that comes in. As students here on campus, we see the changes taking place and are very aware of how the money we help to bring in is being spent to improve Saint Mary's for everyone."

Dr Kapoor's memory lives on

BEFORE HE RETIRED, Dr Brij Mohan Kapoor was the chair of the Biology Department and a highly valued member of our faculty for 35 years. After he passed away suddenly from a heart attack in 2003, his family wanted to honour his memory by making a gift to the university's *Hearts and Minds* Capital Campaign.

Their thoughtful donation has enabled Saint Mary's to create the Dr Brij M. Kapoor Memorial Award. Presented for the first time at the 2008 convocation to Kerry Worth-Marr, this award is given to the graduating student who achieves the highest grade point average in biology at Saint Mary's.

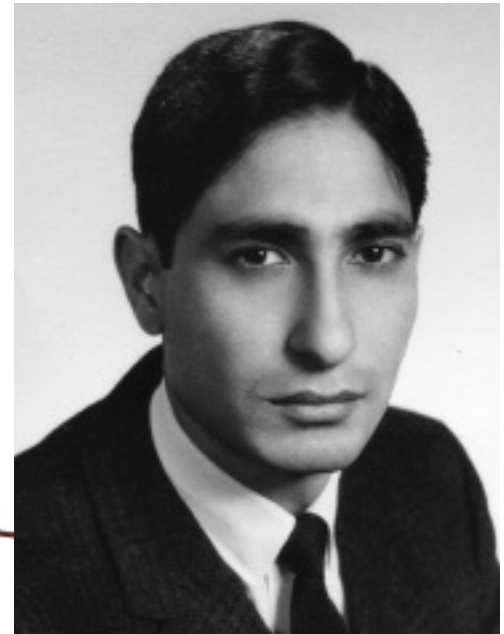
In addition to the award established in Dr Kapoor's name, the university has also established the Dr Brij Mohan Kapoor Teaching Herbarium in the newly renovated Science Building.

Highly respected by his colleagues and students, Dr Kapoor is remembered as a professor who loved

teaching and working with undergraduate students. The idea for creating the herbarium started to evolve last year when a graduate student in biology began organizing and categorizing Dr Kapoor's immaculately pressed and annotated plant specimens. The new herbarium will be a reminder of Dr Kapoor's dedication to academic excellence, and will serve as a useful resource for both students and faculty.

Speaking at the formal dedication of the new herbarium, Dr J Colin Dodds, president of Saint Mary's University, said, "The late Dr Kapoor is the embodiment of Saint Mary's faculty. He was knowledgeable, dedicated and successful in his field, global in his reach and he believed in giving back to his community."

Thanks to the generous gift to the *Hearts and Minds* Capital Campaign from Dr Kapoor's family and the new herbarium that Saint Mary's has created in his honour, Dr Kapoor's legacy will continue to give back to the students of Saint Mary's University for many years to come.

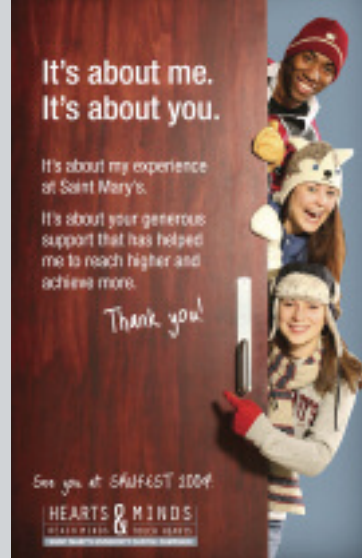
It's about me, it's about you

THE CAMPUS COMMUNITY CAMPAIGN is all about making the Saint Mary's campus better for everyone, particularly the students. This fundraising campaign, aimed specifically at staff and faculty, has a target of \$500,000 – and it is now within sight.

In January the Saint Mary's Development Office kicked off a two-week winter carnival called SMUfest 2009 to thank those who had already contributed and encourage all staff and faculty to consider making a gift. The carnival featured a number of different activities, kicking off with Cinnamon "Bunday" and carrying on with Rock the Block, Winter Warm-up Trivia, SMUSA Valentine's Bingo, and many more events. The Grand Finale included a lunch with third year Sobey School of Business student Jacob Deng, one of the "lost boys" of Sudan, who spoke about the importance of giving back to one's community.

This event increased the campus campaign total to \$369,000, much of which will be used to fund scholarships, bursaries, new buildings on campus, and the Student Experience Fund, supporting initiatives such as field trips and internships. "Our staff and faculty are aware that it can be financially challenging to be a student these days.
