Julia is a fourth-year Science student at Saint Mary's, majoring in biology and with a minor in French. She also plays on the university women's basketball team. The recipient of the Bernard "Bun" Mulcahy Memorial Scholarship, which was established by Myrtle and the late Jim Pineo, BComm '44, Julia has also received other academic and athletic awards. When she finishes her degree at Saint Mary's, she hopes to pursue a career in the medical field.

The scholarships Julia receives make a real difference to her. "They help out so much with my tuition and other

costs, and it means I don't have to worry so much about money during the year. I'm free to concentrate on my studies."

The scholarships helped to entice Julia from her Ancaster, Ontario, home to study in the Maritimes, a move she feels was a good one. "You learn so much more living away from home," she says, "although it is more expensive, which is where the scholarships help so much." She is also very positive about the whole Saint Mary's experience. "Some of my classes here have 20 people in them. You can build a good rapport with your professors and work with them very closely."

Julia sees donations at work in the fabric of the university. The new Science Building has made an enormous difference to her studies. There are new microscopes and

computers in the labs, which, she says, "facilitate better learning."

As she prepares to enter her final year, Julia is "very thankful for the opportunity to study here. I can see what these scholarships do for me and other students. They make a real difference."

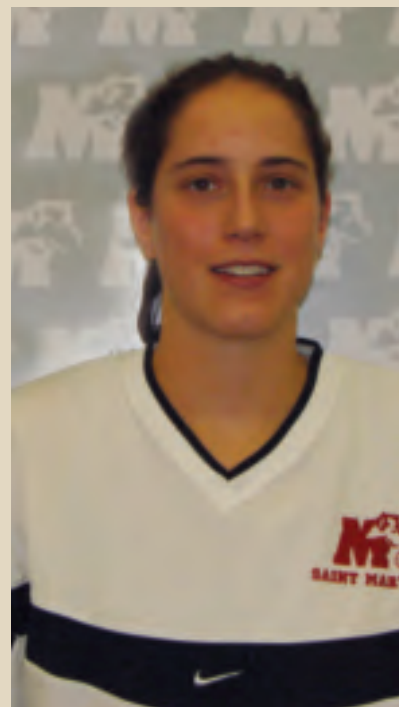

## Seeing student need first-hand

**“Giving to Saint Mary’s** was a pretty easy decision for me,” says assistant director of residence life Kati Kilfoil who has worked at Saint Mary’s for 15 years. “In my view, everyone benefits from improved facilities.”

Kati is lending her financial support to the \$40 million Hearts & Minds Capital Campaign, which is aimed at improving the university’s academic space and other facilities, as well as providing increased research funding and financial aid for students. It is a campaign she believes in.

She also identifies with the culture and spirit of the university itself. “Saint Mary’s is engaged with the local community, it promotes accessibility of education for everyone, and it is diverse, with students from all over the world coming to study here.”

In her work role, she is responsible for assigning housing to students. Part of her job is to help teach students who are living away from home for the first time about life skills, wellness and social development. She also sees the financial pressures many students experience, particularly international students who bear the burden of higher tuition fees.

Kati is able to direct half of her total contribution to the university towards the capital campaign and half towards an international financial scholarship. It’s a choice she appreciates. And she hopes that the way she directs her support will bring about one of the life-changing experiences she has seen students enjoy at Saint Mary’s as a direct result of donor support.



## Learning the language of giving

**Kristy Power** is heading into the home stretch of her Bachelor of Arts degree. A native of Fall River, Nova Scotia, she is majoring in linguistics, with a minor in French. Teaching French immersion at the elementary school level is one of the career options she is contemplating.

Linguistics is the study of language and how it works. As it is still somewhat of a niche area in which to study, Kristy was attracted to Saint Mary’s by the fact that its linguistics program is well established and more extensive than other programs she looked at.

Last year Kristy received the Linguistics Scholarship, which was made possible through the generosity of an anonymous donor. Although she still needed to work part-time while she studied, Kristy says the award was a big help. “It really helped lift the stress off,” she says.

But the award did far more for Kristy than simply alleviate the financial worries she might have. “It’s a wonderful feeling to have other people believe in you,” she explains. “And because it is someone else’s money, it makes you want to work that much harder.”

Kristy also appreciates that the award is directly related to the field of linguistics. “It is not a well known area of study,” she says, “and so to have an award specifically for the study of linguistics is a real recognition of its value as a field.”

Kristy is inspired to work harder at her studies as a result of the award. Recognizing the importance of giving back and extending opportunities to other students in the linguistics field, she looks forward to the day when she is able to make her own contribution to Saint Mary’s.

# The donor who keeps on giving

**Ed Coolen** has been making regular donations to the Saint Mary's annual fund since 1983. He's one of the university's most longstanding and loyal supporters.

Ed Coolen's connection with Saint Mary's goes back a long way, too. He attended Saint Mary's High School and College, when the campus was located at Windsor Street, the

Irish Christian Brothers were the teachers, and tuition was just \$60 a year. He played football, hockey and handball and he also participated in the relatively new Canadian Officers' Training Corps (COTC), which trained undergraduates for officer commissions in the Canadian Army reserves.

When Ed graduated with his Bachelor of Arts in 1939, the world was at war and his life as a global citizen began.

Ed's wartime career saw him serve in England, Scotland, Italy and participate in the liberation of Holland. As a member of the permanent force after the war, he had many postings throughout North America and he retired from the Army with the rank of colonel. Still only in his late forties, he joined the External Affairs department of the Foreign Services, from which he retired in 1983, aged 65.

After all his travels, Halifax was the home to which he returned. Saint Mary's was not only his alma mater but his son Paul's (BA '73) as well. The campus of today is a far cry from what he remembers. "To use that famous word, it is 'awesome'," he says admiringly, referring to the dramatic changes on campus.

Some things remain the same, however. Ed feels that his education – in the class, on the sports field and in COTC exercises – molded him into a "citizen who was ready to go out into the world." That is the mission Saint Mary's continues to pursue and that is the mission Ed Coolen continues to support with his donations, year after year.

# Donations in action—work begins on the new Atrium and Global Learning Commons

**Saint Mary's strives** to provide world-class teaching and learning facilities that allow students to work within an environment that promotes learning and offers opportunities that are unique to the university.

Following hard on the heels of the official opening of the newly renovated Science Building, work is now underway on a new 43,000 square foot, three-storey Atrium and Global Learning Commons that will provide both the university and wider community with an exceptional learning environment.

"We must provide our students, faculty and staff with state-of-the-art tools and learning spaces that foster discovery," said president Dr J Colin Dodds, speaking at the sod turning for the new building on April 29, 2008.

The new \$17.5 million Atrium will be located in the northwest corner of the campus and will be attached to the Science Building, the Patrick Power Library and the Burke Building. On the ground floor will be the glass-roofed Global Learning Commons, a wireless, open-plan communal learning space aimed at encouraging interaction between faculty and students.

The second and third floors will house teaching and study space, offices and an area for computational sciences research. The plans for the Atrium also include a number of exciting architectural features, such as an interior bio-wall, which will work as a natural air filter for the building, and a green roof, which will incorporate a

greenhouse as well as demonstration and research areas. The Atrium will also be designed and constructed to LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) standards.

The Atrium project benefits from \$2 million in funding from the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA). Alumni and other supporters have also made a significant contribution to the project through the Hearts & Minds Capital Campaign.

Chairman of the Saint Mary's Board of Governors, Paul Dyer, says that investment in the Atrium is the result of the commitment and support of the university's alumni and other supporters who believe in Saint Mary's and its mission.

"Saint Mary's has always been at the forefront of education and community developments," says Dyer. "I am proud to be a part of an organization that inspires the kind of vision and commitment to excellence that is unmistakable when you look at our campus."

# Helping students with special needs

**Fred Smithers, OC**, is a long-serving member of the Saint Mary's Board of Governors. Through his work on the board and his wife Dr Nancy Smithers's involvement with local schools, they both became aware of a growing problem: many secondary school students do not have access to a university education because of physical or learning difficulties.

That is why they donated \$1 million to the Atlantic Centre of Research, Access and Support for Students with Disabilities at Saint Mary's University. Established in 1985, the Atlantic Centre works to provide facilities and support to students with special needs. Ten years ago 125 students used the facility; this year there were 300 students.

Dr David Leitch, director of the Atlantic Centre since its inception, the money comes as a wonderful gift. He explains that as the number of students has grown, the pressure to finance that growth has placed great strain on the centre's operation.

The donation from Fred and Nancy Smithers has dramatically changed the outlook of the centre. Not only has it given everyone who works at the centre a huge boost of confidence for the future, says Dr Leitch, but it will enable them to extend their programs, hire another counsellor, and provide more support in the classroom. It will also enable the centre to continue to explore partnerships with other universities and schools, such as Landmark College in Vermont.

For Fred Smithers, however, this is just the start of something much bigger. Recently retired from his company, Secunda Marine, he plans to "get out his running shoes" and continue his efforts on behalf of Saint Mary's.

The students who use the Atlantic Centre may be visually or hearing impaired, some are in wheelchairs, and many have learning disabilities, such as attention deficit syndrome. Long regarded as a centre of excellence, the Atlantic Centre regularly provides information to colleges and universities from all over Canada and the United States that want to develop their own programs.

"The work the Atlantic Centre is doing is truly ground-breaking," says Fred Smithers. "There are special voice recognition computers so that students can replay lectures over again, and classrooms have been redesigned and equipped to make them accessible. But the need continues to grow."
